



GCSE Results 2020; Frequently Asked Questions

Receiving results is an important milestone in a student's life. Results day itself is a culmination of years of hard work for both students and their schools. We'd like to congratulate everyone receiving results in summer 2020.

How have my grades been calculated?

As you are aware, the Awarded (or official) Grade will now be the higher of two other types of grade:

- 1. The Centre Assessment Grade.** This is the grade generated by the School.
- 2. The Calculated Grade.** This is the grade generated by OFQUAL using an algorithm.

The Awarded (or official) Grade is the one that is in your results envelope and will appear on your certificates when they are published later this term.

How do I appeal?

The finalised OFQUAL guidance will be published next week.
