Re: PCP1 – Target Setting for 2020-21

As we finish the first half of the Michaelmas term, access is now available to your son / daughter's first Progress Checkpoint (PCP1) report online using GO 4 Schools.

The aim of the first report of the academic year is to inform you of the minimum target grade your child should be striving to achieve in each of their subjects. Though annually reviewed, the targets provide a long term goal for students in terms of their potential in each curriculum subject taught and provide a benchmark they should be striving to achieve or even surpass each year. Targets are set in order to ensure that our students perform in line with the top 5% of all students nationally, relative to their individual starting points.

At the next reporting point (PCP2) later this term you will be provided with an Attitude to Learning (A2L) grade and a progress indicator for each subject your child studies. We hope this will be useful to help you gain a sense of how well your child is progressing in their studies this academic year.

How to access the report:

To access the report, go to the GO 4 Schools site: enter www.go4schools.com and click on the Parents icon at the top of the main page to arrive at the log-in screen. The email address you use to enter the site must be the one you have provided to the school.

To request a password for GO 4 Schools, please enter your email address into the First-time User field and click 'Please send me a password'. A password will then be generated and sent to your email address. You will then be able to log into the site and view your son / daughter's page.
